Nonino Prize 2018

In a world more and more conformed by globalization, the valorization and the discovery of what's local becomes a priceless value – this is why the Nonino Prize, nowadays, is more and more important.

Born to protect the rural civilization, since 1975 during the last Saturday of January at the Nonino distilleries the prize (which for 5 times has anticipated the choices of the Nobel Prize and which has been defined by Clause Lévi-Strauss one of the most exotic experiences of his life) spotlights crucial matters that too often are neglected.

Now at the 43rd edition, this year the prestigious acknowledgement has awarded the Nonino Prize 2018 Master of our time to Giorgio Agamben, one of the most important figures of contemporary philosophy, and the author of the very influential collection of volumes *Homo sacer*, the Nonino International Prize to the Albanian writer Ismail Kadare who has made religious tolerance one of the basis of his work, and the Nonino Risit d'Aur Prize 2018 to P(our), an international charity project founded by Alex Kratena, Ryan Chetiyawardana, Jim Meehan, Simone Caporale, Monica Berg, Joerg Meyer and Xavier Padovani with the aim of creating a global community of bartenders, sommeliers, brewers, distillers and wine producers that can stimulate and reinvent the beverage world.
